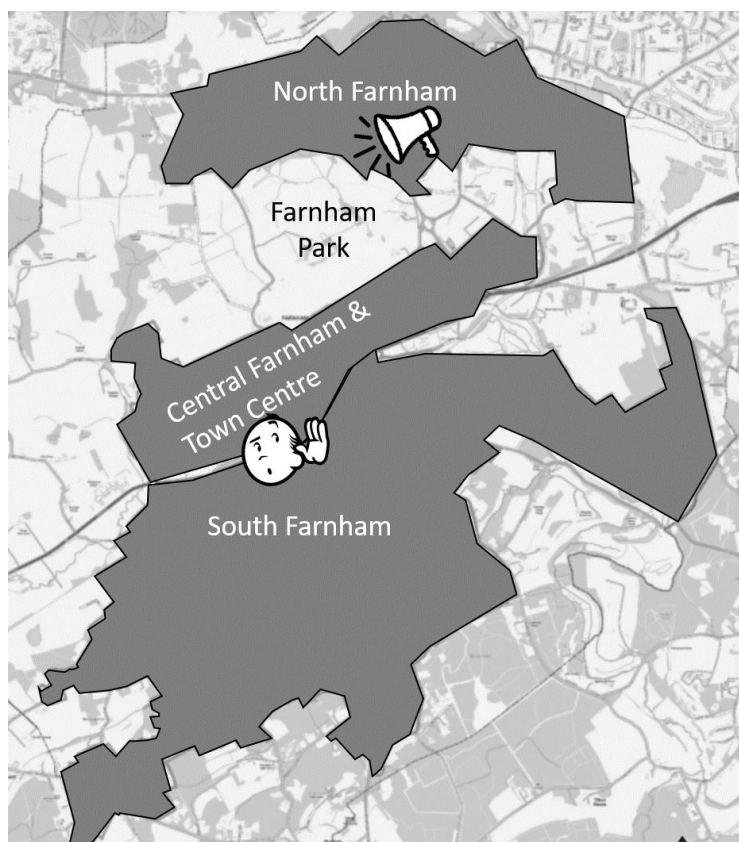

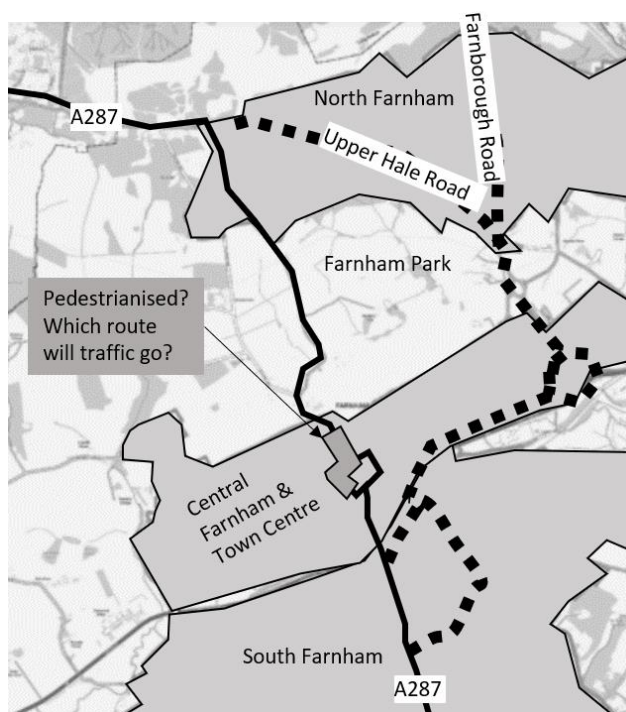

The Farnham Infrastructure Programme includes proposed projects which the three councils believe are key to ease congestion and transport issues across the town, these are:

- Lowering speed limits in the town centre
- Rerouting non-local HGVs away from Upper Hale and town centre
- Developing a better town centre infrastructure
- Improving connections between areas of the town
- Improving A31 Bypass at the junction with Hickley's Corner
- A325 new Wrecclesham Relief road

We are all being asked if we agree. Obviously, improvements to the town will be very welcome but we must make sure that what is good for Farnham is also good for our villages in North Farnham too.

What if the centre of town is pedestrianised? There would only be one route north south left.



Questions

- Are traffic volumes and speeds safe and acceptable?
- Are there sufficient safe places to cross the roads?
- Are there adequate pavements?
- Are there good safe cycle routes?
- Can the children walk / cycle safely to school?
- Is there anywhere for them to go after school?
- Are the buses convenient, reliability, affordable, clean and safety?
- Are there adequate amenities in your village?
- Is it easy to get to the doctors?

If you find yourself answering 'NO' to any of these questions say so!
